


**Commons Registration Act 1965, Section 13**  
**Application for Registration of Land which became a Town or Village Green after**  
**2 January 1970**

I refer to the application submitted on behalf of Redmarshall Parish Council for registration of the land ("the land") edged pink on the site plan marked "MAP A", accompanying the application, as a town or village green under Section 13 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 ("the 1965 Act").

Having considered the said application and accompanying maps and appendices; the objection submitted on behalf of Mr W C Hingley and accompanying statements; and the response to the objections, together with its accompanying appendices, submitted by Redmarshall Parish Council, I am satisfied that the land has become a town or village green under the aforesaid Section of the 1965 Act by virtue of the fact that it is land on which for not less than twenty years a significant number of the inhabitants of Redmarshall or of the neighbourhood within the locality in which the land is situated, have indulged in lawful sports and pastimes as of right.

For and on behalf of Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council as the Registration Authority, and in accordance with delegated function 2 on page 75 of the Council's Constitution, I therefore accept the application.
