

Honeypot Wood is a place where you can enjoy a diverse range of habitats, an abundance of wildlife, take a pleasant walk through maturing woodland and sit and relax beside the stream.

Formerly an open cast sand and gravel extraction site and landfill tip the site was reclaimed in the early 1990's to manage the site for wildlife.

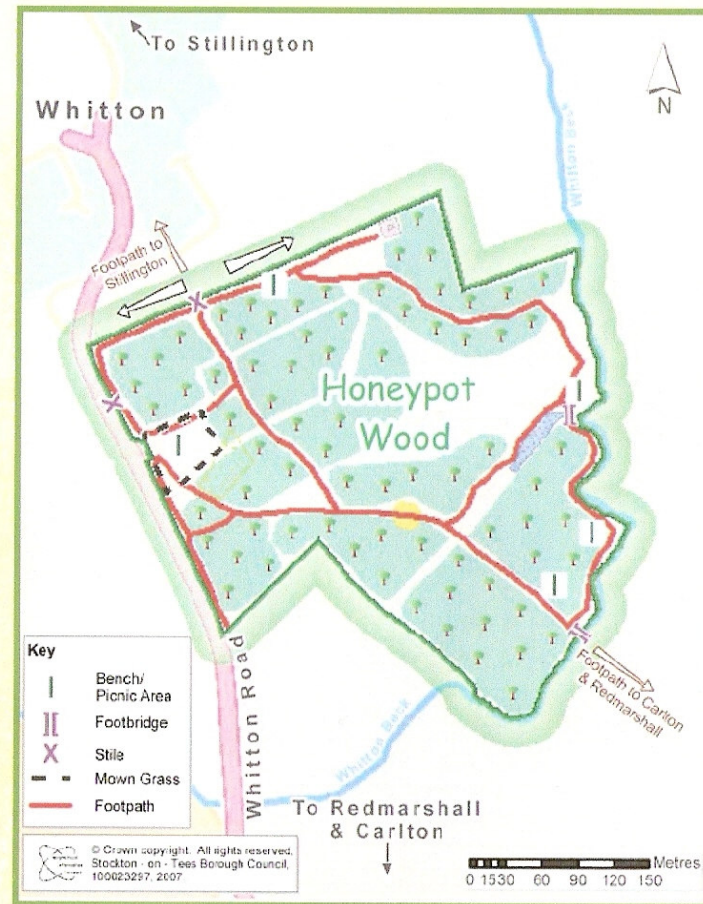
The site has over 7 hectares of maturing woodland, open grass areas, a beck and a network of mown paths.

### WOODLAND:

The maturing woodland provides food and nesting sites for a variety of birds such as the wren, blackbird, mistle thrush and robin.

### GRASSLAND:

The rough grassland provides shelter to small mammals like the shrew, mole, and field mouse.



The network of footpaths makes the wood easy for visitors to enjoy the pleasant surroundings. Picnic tables, seating, viewing areas and information boards can be found at the woodland, contributing to a pleasant and enjoyable visit.

### WILDFLOWER AREAS:

The richer parts of the grassland enable numerous wildflowers to flourish, such as red clover, creeping buttercup, ox-eye daisy, cowslip and betony that in turn attract a variety of butterflies such as the red admiral, small skipper and peacock.

### WETLAND AREA:

An area of wetland that has rushes, reeds and sedges provides a rich environment for birds, mammals, amphibians, insects and microscopic organisms.
