It is necessary to advertise the fact that the Parish Council have adopted the new Code of Conduct and to make copies available. Stockton Borough Council are willing to include Parish Councils in an advert they will be doing, and Redmarshall Parish Council would wish to be included in this. It will also be put onto the Redmarshall Parish Council website.

Copies of the Code were issued to all members, and David Bond will email a model Code of Conduct for the Parish Council to use for adoption. This model Contract will be presented for adoption of all mandatory provisions of the new code of conduct, and para 12.2, at the next Parish Council Meeting.

It will be necessary for Members to also fill in a new notification of personal interests.

David ended his presentation by offering to answer any queries Councillors have before they accept the new Code.

Matters Arising (02/06/07)

Drovers Lane – Cllr Bowker had spoken to the resident who was going to do the checks, and he has confirmed he still intends to do these but has been delayed due to heavy workload.

Finance (03/06/07)

- **Cheques** – None.
- **Petty Cash** – Petty cash stands and was checked at £5.51.
- **Audit** – A meeting was held by Cllrs T Bowker, S Bell, J Stevens and J Turnbull on the 4 June 2007. They checked and verified the accounts ready for audit submission – Cllr Turnbull asked if anyone else would like to check these over, but everyone was happy that these now be put to the Internal Auditor – with the small proviso of two missing receipts – one for the Local Review 8/5/06 (minutes 2/05/06 No 30); and Open Spaces subscription 11/9/06 (minutes 2/9/06 minute No 17). Acceptance was proposed by Cllr Stevens, seconded by Cllr Bell and agreed unanimously.

Village Green (04/06/07)

Cllr Bowker and Cllr Turnbull visited James & Baker, Solicitors, on the 30 May 2007. All looked straightforward, and the Contract and Land Registry document were presented to the Parish Council. If Mr Hingley's Solicitors Punch Robson agree the Contract, it can then go ahead. We would then pay £1,000 to Impetus when the Solicitor gets in touch. It is hoped that it will all be complete by the end of June.

Regarding the Trust on the land, James & Baker are going to look at how Carlton land is set up. Main concern is that it is not in the name of the Parish Council, but by the Parish Council in trust for the village.

It is hoped that the requested party can be organised once everything is complete.

Clarion Homes Land (05/06/07)

It was agreed that as enforcement had been successful, this item could now come off the Agenda.

Open Forum

Mr Lambert brought up the following issues –

- A weight restriction of 7.5 tons had been been put on Junction Road. There used to be one on the Stillington road and the current lack of one was questioned. It was suggested by Councillors that strengthening of the bridge meant there was not longer a restriction, but Cllr Turnbull said that if Mr Lambert wanted clarification he could speak to Ian Braithwaite or Brian Buckley, Engineers at Stockton Borough Council.
- Whether any decision had been made regarding the future of local Post Offices, ie Carlton and Stillington. It was confirmed that nothing had been decided yet.
- Questioned when was the last time a policeman had been seen in the village, but Councillors mentioned several of late – a mounted policeman the previous Saturday; the Community Policeman Eric Young had been seen recently; and two beat bobbies had been on the road to Carlton.
- Road sign for Kirk Hill is on the road to Stillington – should be going up to Carlton. Parish Clerk to write to Care of Your Area.
